## Goals and structure of supply chain dialogue

- Work package 4 of EU LOWINFOOD project focuses on seafood supply chain aims to improve total value of biomaterials along the fish supply chain in Scotland and Germany.
- The whole-chain **stakeholder dialogue** explores hotspots loss and waste, scope for cooperation opportunities between actors to improve the value of seafood products and by-products, build new relationships, and promote awareness and adoption of innovations





## Early recommendations from the supply chain dialogue

- Quantification and characterisation of by-product flows through better data collection
- Developing standards along the supply chain to improve catching, processing and storage conditions in locations seafood is exported from
- Reducing distances and transaction costs for SMEs; identifying wider business cases for by-catch and side-streams through local clusters
- Supporting research to further optimise catch and reduce labour need
